## Population, Geographical Features & Weather

Greece is located in South-east Europe, part of the Balkan peninsula.



• The country's population is about 10,5 million people and the land area is 131.944 square kilometers.





The climate is primarily Mediterranean with mild, wet winters and hot and dry summers.



### National Symbols, Language

• Our flag consists of nine horizontal stripes – five blue and four white- which alternate.

On the top left corner there is a white cross. According to popular tradition, the nine stripes represent the nine syllables of the phrase  $\Xi \lambda \epsilon \nu \theta \epsilon \rho i \alpha \dot{\eta} \Theta \dot{\alpha} \nu \alpha \tau \sigma \varsigma$  ("Freedom or Death"), the five blue stripes for the syllables " $\Xi \lambda \epsilon \nu \theta \epsilon \rho i a$ " and the four white stripes " $\Theta \dot{\alpha} \nu \alpha \tau \sigma \varsigma$ ".

The nine stripes are also said to represent the letters of the word "freedom" (Greek: ελευθερία- eleftheria). The blue and the white symbolize the colours of the famous Greek sky and sea, combined with the colors of the clouds and waves.

• The National Emblem of the Republic of Greece consists of a blue escutcheon(looks like a shield) with a white cross in the centre, completely surrounded by two laurel branches.





- The official language of Greece is "Greek" and has been used for writing since the 8<sup>th</sup> century BC.
- There are 24 letters-each in uppercase and lowercase forms- and it consists of 17 consonants and 7 vowels.

• Full accession of Greece in the **European Union** took place on the 1st of January 1981, making Greece the 10<sup>th</sup> member to join.



## Capital, Main Cities & Landmarks

• Athens is the capital of Greece since 1834 and the biggest city in the country. It is named after the goddess "Athena". It also has a population of about 4 million people.





Thessaloniki is the second largest city in Greece. It is situated in Macedonia.



Patras is a big city in Peloponnese and connects Greece with Europe via its big port.



Volos is our city. It's situated by the sea, in the region of Thessaly.



**Ioannina** lies in Epirus and it is built on the shore of lake Pamvotis.



The **Parthenon** was built in Athens, in honor of the goddess **Athena**.



**Santorini or Thira** is an island in the Aegean Sea and it's built upon the crater of a volcano.



**Meteora** is a formation of dark sandstone rocks that rise outside Kalambaka. A complex of monasteries are built on top of these unique columns of rock.




**Parnassos** is one of the highest Greek mountains in central Greece. It is famous for the National Park and its modern ski resort.

### The official religion in Greece is the **Eastern Orthodox church of Christ.**




The **Minoan civilization** is the first advanced civilization in Europe and flourished in Crete.


Alexander the Great was the king of Macedonia in Greece. Being brave and undefeated in battles, managed to expand his empire to India.

• The Greek Revolution in 1821 took place in order to send away the Ottoman Rule and be able to create an independent state.




 Greece was involved in both the First World War and the Second World War by the side of the winners.

 "Tsamikos" is one of the most characteristic traditional dances of Greece.








• The greatest storyteller and fable maker of Greece is **Aesop**. His fables not only amuse but also teach children from the ancient times until today.

### Other interesting facts


The Olympic Games originate in Greece. In the modern times, they were relived in 1896. The first modern Olympics took place in Athens and then again in 2004.








 Greek Literature has been honored with two Nobel prizes until now. The poet George Seferis was awarded the prize in 1963 and Odysseus Elytis in 1979.
